Q. How can I donate?

Q. How are the funds used? As a donor, how can I be assured that the funds are directed exclusively to victims of the Gaza conflict?

Based on the changing needs on the ground, the initial tranche of funds will go towards efforts in acute relief, particularly to purchase emergency supplies to stabilize the lives of the victims.

Subsequently, depending on the funds raised, Mercy Relief would continue to implement longer term rehabilitation and rebuilding efforts for victims.

Mercy Relief will work closely with local authorities and our local NGO partners, the Palestinian Wefaq Association (http://www.wefaqpal.ps/) for all our efforts.

Q. I want to give old clothes, food, slippers, etc. Do you accept donations-in-kind?

A. Unfortunately, we are unable to accept donations-in-kind due to constraints in logistics, storage and transportation. As part of responding to this critical phase, donations in the form of cash allows us greater flexibility and better efficiency in reaching out and providing relief supplies to the victims who need it the most, minimising the duplication of items at the affected grounds.

Q. I want to volunteer! How can I apply?

A. Thank you for your interest to volunteer with Mercy Relief!

Mercy Relief only deploys trained personnel for its overseas relief missions to ensure the safety and security of our relief operations. Thus, we do not typically send general volunteers from Singapore, unless they have specialized skills such as medicine.

However, we do need all the help we can get for local activities, and are looking for committed volunteers to join our cause. A new volunteer team has been set up recently to help organize fundraising efforts during disasters. This team is still lean and we're hoping for more sign-ups. Additionally, we are also looking for volunteers to help with school talks to raise awareness about disaster relief.
